

Memorandum of Understanding between San Juan College and Western New Mexico University

*San Juan College and Western New Mexico University proudly announce the collaboration of efforts and resources to promote educational and career opportunities for New Mexico students and beyond by creating a **Master Articulation Agreement**.*

I. PURPOSE

This memorandum of understanding is designed to encourage completion of the associate's degree and support transition and completion of the bachelor's degree by agreement to coordinate transfer policies, enhance advising, and promote the acceptance of the programmatic transfer of courses/credits between San Juan College (SJC) and Western New Mexico University (WNMU).

II. ELEMENTS OF THE AGREEMENT

A. Admissions Practices

1. WNMU guarantees admission for students from SJC upon completion of an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science degree program.
2. SJC students will have access to advising by WNMU staff before, during, and after the transition to WNMU. SJC will assist WNMU advising staff in contacting SJC students in the relevant degree programs to advise them of the transfer degree programs available at WNMU.
3. Dual Enrollment for SJC students. SJC students who declare the intention of transferring to WNMU will be offered the following support while completing their SJC degrees: (a) A WNMU advisor will be assigned to assist in course selection and ensure that SJC courses will apply to the student's selected degree program at WNMU; (b) SJC students may receive access to selected student services and privileges at WNMU while at SJC, e.g., access to the library, fine arts and cultural events, and admission to sports events; (c) SJC students will be eligible for transfer student scholarships without further application.
4. Terms of Admissions: SJC students who accumulate college credits after graduation from SJC and before admission to WNMU become subject to the following transfer policy: *a transfer student whose combined GPA from all transfer institutions falls below WNMU's acceptable standards (as described in the appropriate WNMU catalog), will enter with probationary status regardless of his/her status at the institution from*

which the transfer was made. Developmental courses do not count toward any degree completion.

B. Acceptance and Application of Credits

1. All courses completed within Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate of Applied Sciences programs that meet the New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED) General Education Program requirements, including those courses on the New Mexico Higher Education Department's General Education transfer matrix, will fulfill WNMU's General Education Program requirements and will transfer as WNMU General Education Program requirements and will apply toward WNMU baccalaureate degree requirements. Students who have graduated from SJC with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree have completed all General Education requirements for baccalaureate degree programs at WNMU.
2. All the coursework required for the Associate of Arts/Associate of Science degree will be applied toward completing WNMU's baccalaureate degrees. However, prerequisite or other degree-specific courses may be required by WNMU baccalaureate programs.
3. SJC students who earn an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science or have completed an internship course of at least one credit hour will have Western New Mexico University's Service Learning course requirements waived.
4. SJC students who complete the NMHED General Education Program requirements will be given six (6) credits (of the total 12) to meet WNMU's Intensive Writing course requirements.
5. SJC students who earn an Associate of Applied Sciences degree will have their general education courses applied to the bachelor's degree general education requirements at WNMU. They may still need to complete additional credits to meet the required general education requirements.
6. A candidate for any WNMU baccalaureate degree must meet the additional and specific requirements indicated for the degree program outlined in the WNMU catalog. Students will follow the degree program requirements of the WNMU catalog for their initial year of enrollment at SJC. That program is an option for six years, or a student may elect to use requirements described in any subsequent/future catalog.
7. Limit on hours earned through ACT and CLEP examinations, Adult Learning and Education Experiences, AP, and correspondence work (or combination of the previous) will apply as described in the WNMU catalog.

C. Program Exchange and Specific Articulation Agreements

1. WNMU and SJC will work together to identify and recruit SJC and WNMU students from foreign communities and/or indigenous colleges with whom WNMU or SJC has articulation agreements. SJC areas of enrollment focus will include the Center for Workforce Development; School of Energy; and School of Business Information

Technology, and Social Sciences.

2. WNMU and SJC agree to prioritize the completion of individual articulation agreements in the disciplines of Business Administration, Education and Health Sciences, School of Energy, and Workforce Development Training programs.

D. Other Areas of Collaboration

1. WNMU and SJC agree to foster a collaborative relationship by offering the other the opportunity to partner in new and emerging academic and non-academic activities and programs. Activities or programs may include but are not limited to (a) research, cultural, and educational exchange activities; (b) grant application for the development of new academic and non-academic programs; (c) development of special, short-term academic programs; (d) participation in seminars and academic research meetings; (e) exchange of academic materials, publications, and other resources.

E. Separate Agreements

1. WNMU and SJC agree that each school will designate a Liaison Officer to develop and coordinate specific activities or programs before initiating any specific activity or programs.

F. Implementation of the Agreement

1. WNMU and SJC agree to review this agreement every third year from inception or as needed. SJC and WNMU will designate an individual to serve as a liaison for monitoring this agreement. Each institution will provide updated catalogs to the other immediately upon their availability. Upon request, WNMU agrees to provide SJC reports on enrolled SJC transfer students, their majors, and academic performance to the extent permitted by law. WNMU and SJC agree to assist each other in promoting this agreement appropriately in their respective promotional materials, events, websites, and reports.

3. SJC and WNMU will cooperate in developing program-specific articulation agreements. These agreements may be developed and amended without affecting this Master Agreement.
4. This agreement will remain in effect until terminated by either party on ninety (90) days prior to written notice. In the event of the dissolution of this agreement, the terms contained herein will remain in effect for the maximum transitional period of

two (2) years to accommodate students already enrolled under the agreement

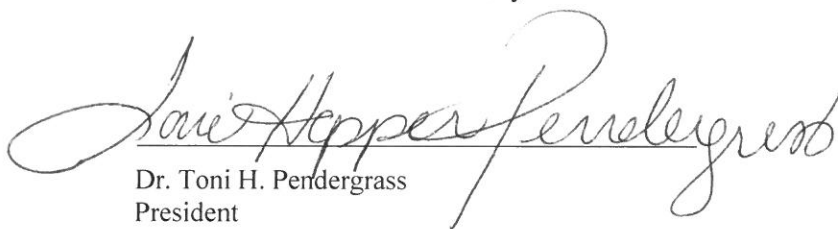
5. Special cases not explicitly or implicitly described in the current MOU will be considered on a case-by-case basis by mutual agreement between SJC /WNMU representatives.
